Do you need legal help to get care for a sick child?

Children who live in poverty are exposed to serious health risks at a higher rate. We can provide legal help to get appropriate care for a child who is sick or injured.

New Britain's children are at risk.

In New Britain, more than 25 percent of children live below the federal poverty level, according to 2000 census information. Children need access to health care. Poverty, as well as language or cultural barriers, put children at greater risk.

Are you eligible for MLPP help?

The MLPP represents low-income families, and there is no charge for its services. You can be referred by your affiliated pediatric or family medicine provider.

Help is nearby.

MLPP is offered through The Hospital of Central Connecticut. In addition, MLPP has offices in Hartford at Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center, the Connecticut Children's Medical Center, Burgdorf/Bank of America Health Center, Charter Oak Health Center, and Community Health Services, Inc.
